# **Environmental Work Method Statement PCB Sampling**



### 1. PCB Sampling

Collection of PCB oil samples must be undertaken in accordance with the instructions in this EWMS. PCB oil samples should be sent to Ausgrid's Insulating Oil Testing Laboratory.

## 2. Sampling oil and oil filled equipment

These requirements must be undertaken when sampling oil or equipment:

- 1. Collect PCB oil samples in clean jars. Jars and sample tags are available from the Insulating Oil Testing Laboratory, email tim.yang@ausgrid.com.au.
- 2. Drain all water from equipment prior to collecting oil samples for testing.
- 3. Collect 20-30 mL of oil for PCB content testing.
- 4. Label sample jars with a pre-printed sticker label as shown in Figure 1. Alternatively, a label can be tied to the sample jar if sticker labels are not available.

The following information must be included on the sample labels:

Note: If oil has been drained from equipment into drums, then the sample tag must include details sufficient to identify the drum, location and where the oil came from.

- 5. Care should be taken to avoid cross-contamination of oil samples from different items of equipment.
- 6. Deliver samples to the laboratory as soon as possible (within 7 days).

#### 3. Oil containment tank sampling

These requirements must be undertaken when sampling oil containment tanks:

- Collect samples in clean 1 L sample bottles (fill completely). These can be supplied by the laboratory.
- Collect an oil sample from the top of the tank above the water level.
- Label sample bottles either on the bottle or with a tied pre-printed label.

- Include the following information on the sample labels:
  - substation number and substation name
  - date of sampling
  - details of which chamber or oil containment tank the sample was collected from.
- Deliver samples to the laboratory as soon as possible (within 7 days).

# 4. Sample results

Oil sample results will be made available within 5 working days of receipt of the sample. Allowances can be made for emergencies.

Samples which do not meet the sampling requirements may be rejected by the laboratory.
