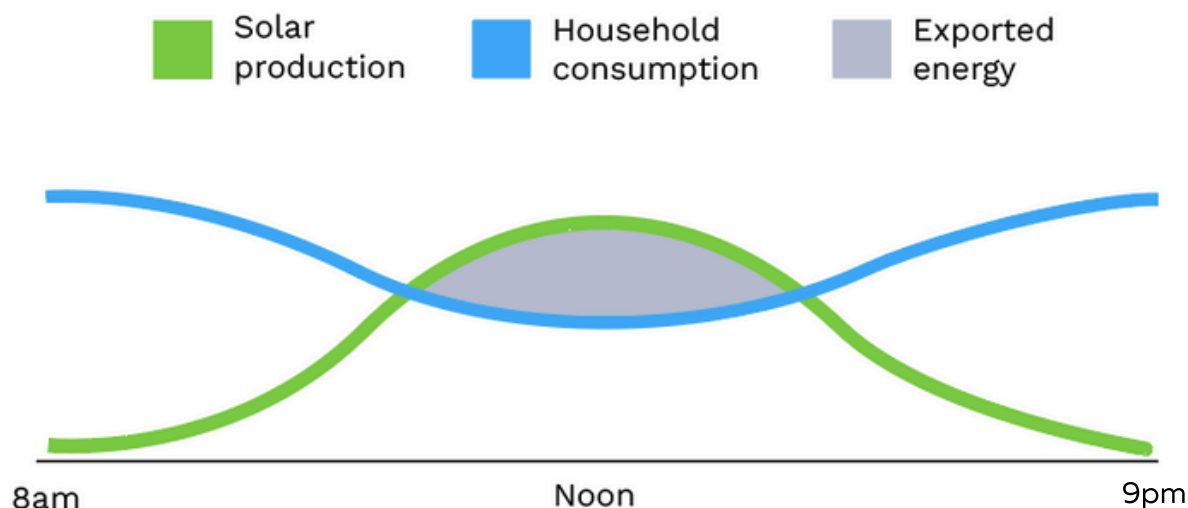


Understanding Solar Tariffs



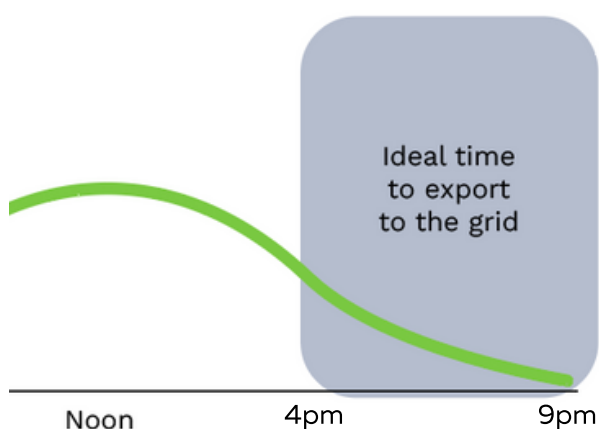
How solar impacts the electricity network

When solar production is at its highest, in the middle of the day, most people are away from home causing a surge in solar exports to the network. This puts a strain on the infrastructure Ausgrid operates.



To manage this increased flow of solar into the network, we have introduced a **two-way-tariff** that is charged to retailers for customers who **export over a threshold**. These prices are charged to your retailer, and it is up to your retailer to decide whether, and if so, how, they pass the charges on to you.

This tariff may reduce the amount you are paid for your solar feed in during the middle of the day when there is an excess of solar supply. To balance this, Ausgrid offers rewards where exports to the grid occurs in peak periods later in the day, reducing network demand and easing the cost of electricity for everyone.
